



Great big light

at the end of the tunnel

Its amazing how COVID-19 still rears its head today in so many corners of stories. It is the reason, though, that Hardin Valley today has a little boutique tucked away in its shopping center off Charlevoix Road.

Abbi White opened Southern Valley Boutique last May, after becoming an aesthetician who couldn't find any sort of work in the field because of COVID-19 restrictions.

"I couldn't get a job anywhere," she remembered, "not even as a receptionist or anything because you're just touching people's faces and stuff."

White wound up working for her father, the owner of the Ford

dealerships at Parkside Drive and Kingston Pike, working the phones and handling inside and online sales for a year before finding "the boutique world," as she put it.

It proved to be a great big light at the end of the tunnel, from which she now has emerged as the one-woman band currently keeping her very own boutique's brass banging. I definitely couldn't do it without the customers,"

"I do every single bit of everything that happens here," she explained. "I deal with the online. I deal with the tax portions. I deal with the bank. I go to market. ... I do the pricing, streaming, the photography — everything.

"It's difficult," White confessed with a smile, "but I've learned my way around it."

It comes somewhat naturally, however, as she — apart from her time at her dad's shops — has worked retail since she was 16 years old. Now 24, she's acquired quite the eye for fashion.

As for opening her own boutique, "I always knew I wanted to do it," she said. "I just didn't think I was going to be able to so early."

So, with October being Women's Small Business Month, we celebrate White and her Southern Valley Boutique, which has just about any southern valley desire a customer could want.

And it's her customers who drive her. "I definitely couldn't do it without the customers," she said. "So, I listen to the customers and kind of gauge what they want, and what they see and what they see for here. So, whatever they feel they need, then they don't have to go 20 or 30 minutes away. We try to carry it."

She learned early, "Nothing is going to work if I just try to do my own thing," the owner said.

White's boutique carries everything from room sprays to earrings and other jewelry to lotions and perfumes, purses and, of course, clothing. And there's plenty for the Volunteer fan to choose from for game day.

"Everything so far," she said, "has gone better than expected."

White is hoping to have a helper hired by her first Black Friday and ahead for the rest of the holiday shopping season — somebody else to help carry the boutique's exist-



ing tune she's played since opening the doors.

Southern Valley Boutique, located at 10653 Hardin Valley Road, is open from 10:30 a.m. to 6:30 p.m., Tuesday through Friday; and from 10:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., Saturday; and can be found across all social platforms.



Special education issues

"I mainly wanted to talk about special education, which I know they talk about," said the parent of a special education student.

"... I know that they are doing a lot, that it's been a big topic of discussion," she added. "I do still feel that my son, being very sick and disabled, that a lot of the things we're doing don't apply to him still. Anytime I get a survey, we have a special life survey, it doesn't apply to him at all."

Though the child is in middle school, "cognitively (he's) about 12 months old," the parent said. "He's working on building a friend, learning colors. ... and he also has seizures. He's had three at school today.

"So I know school's for education, but he can't be educated unless his basic needs are met, which are his health and safety."

Though the parent said, "We find that it's such a process to get those needs met, that his education has been just not happening," it was added, "his teacher this year is wonderful.

"She is trying, but the special Ed teachers do not have enough support from the school district in my opinion," the parent further expressed. "I don't think (the child's) teacher gets a planning period. Sometimes she doesn't get lunch.

"... I know my son's classroom is shortstaffed, they don't have enough. I think, actually, staff is the problem. I don't know that there's an open position, but they can't take care of the kids that are in there, the staff they have.

"My son has a one-to-eight (ratio) because it's been in his IEP. So what happens is he, I think, is being taken care of, but not the others. ... One aide has to be with my son, which only leaves a teacher and another aid for five or six kids. So, some of those kids need one-to-one help. So I think that's part of the problem."

In short, "I don't think the staffing is matching the needs of the children, which I think overall there's a lot of issues we can talk about, but I think that would make a huge difference," the parent said. "I don't know that the staff is supported: they're supposed to have modified curriculum.

"My son was getting pulled out into another special Ed room to go to math, but the teacher had multiple kids from there all doing different things in math ... That means she has to lesson plan for eight different kids every day in special Ed. That's not really feasible for a teacher."

Concerning special education teachers, "I think they get burned out," the parent said. "... They pull staff for trainings a lot. Like, his teacher has been gone three times this year for training through Knox County, but that (leaves) the classroom short staffed, which in special Ed is a big safety issue. ...

"... And again, I know Knox County is making a big effort, and they're sending out all this stuff to parents to get feedback, but none of it is in a way that I can answer (and) explain where we're going."

However, "I am very excited to see there's a virtual option," she said. "I signed up as soon as I saw that. So hopefully, I'll get chosen."

Though it was said, "You have these focus groups of parents," this parent also added, "The parents whose kids are struggling the most don't have any time to come. I can't come to a meeting in the evening — I can't with (her husband's) job. So I think you're missing the experience of the parents of the kids that are at the severe ends because they can't (participate). ... We're literally trying to keep our kids alive day to day. And so we can't attend all these actual things. We're struggling so much. It's survival mode day to day."

"... And so it's very frustrating. It just leaves you feeling like no one cares about your child."

Though the parent said, "His teacher loves him," she added, "The actions of the county

are showing me that they do not care about my son."

Evacuations/special ed

"Things like the evacuations that have unfortunately been happening. It's scary for everyone," another parent of a special needs child said, adding, "they don't understand what's happening."

During one of the recent school evacuations — happening due to what turned out to be false threats — "His nurse carried him because (that) child was (disabled), he could barely walk at all, very slowly. He didn't have a way to evacuate. They evacuated from the middle school to the high school football field. You've got all these special ed kids. ... If the threat would have been real and something would have happened, all those kids would have been by the door."

Rysewyk's summary

Rysewyk met with local media briefly after hearing the parents.

Overall, "Great suggestions ... I heard everything from bus drivers, how we do that, to snow days, how we do that, to individual schools and concerns and celebrations that people had about their school where their student goes,"

Rysewyk said. "Again, stuff that we'll be able to take back and look at and see if there are things that we can do to continue to serve our students better."

Dealing with recent threats

"Some of the things that are important right now in education (included) some families wanting to talk about just the increase of threats," he said about a couple of threats made at Hardin Valley Middle School causing two evacuations earlier this school year. "We're seeing that nationally right now ... So that was good to talk to them, explain some things with them, hear their concerns and their questions," he added.


One question was, "Is there any way to communicate to youth who may pull pranks that turn into big deals ... the seriousness; or any solution to avoid what's happening at the middle school? I'm sure it's a tough thing.

"I have met with (Knox County) Sheriff (Tom) Spangler and (Knox County Juvenile) Judge (Tim) Irwin as well," Rysewyk responded. "We've had the same conversations. ... There's a message to the parents to continue to ask your kids questions, be aware of where they are, what they're doing, what they're saying.

"Then also for the students — this is an impact on learning, obviously," he added. "It's

an impact on your peers. There's a lot of kids who are anxious for these situations when they happen. ...

"Then finally, laws have changed. This is actually something that law enforcement gets involved with now. It'll be something that will be on a student's record and have consequences not just at school, but also in their personal life. It's a big deal. It's not a funny prank anymore. These are very seriously taken by the new laws that were passed last year."

Ex-golfer, ex-teacher to serve up cold, delicious delights at Lolli & Bobo's Ice Cream Shoppe

Hardin Valley is about to get a sweet treat with Lolli & Bobo's Ice Cream Shoppe when Joe and Sharon Wallman set up shop soon.

The Wallmans, the parents of five — affectionately called Lolli and Bobo by their six grandchildren — started their company a few years ago in Oak Ridge and have been serving up cold, delicious delights since. They are excited about their new location and ongoing success.

Bobo spent 20 years as a PGA golf pro before turning his focus on real estate, retiring from the former before making a successful name for himself in the Delaware, Maryland and Virginia real estate markets.

Lolli spent more than 30 years as a preschool teacher. But when their daughter announced she and her husband were heading south, along with other family members who were moving down to help with a church they were starting, the Wallmans got hit dangerously hard by COVID-19 and decided life was too short not to be around their family. Especially anxious to see their grandchildren, with a seventh one on the way, the couple headed down themselves.

"When the pandemic hit," Bobo said, "my daughter and son-in-

law launched (Heart and Soul Church) here in Knoxville." Ever the realtor, Bobo kept his ear to the ground, hearing of a so-called turn-key ice cream shop in Oak Ridge, which piqued their interest. "We were like, 'We can do an ice cream shop,'" Bobo recounted. And a blessing it was, he said, adding he wound up knowing the listing agent — and the deal was done.

"It wasn't turn-key by any stretch of the imagination," Bobo laughed when referencing their new 10914 Spring Bluff Way location.

They rolled up their sleeves and got to work, initially thinking their catch was going to be coated cones, he said. But as any new owner of an ice cream shop may do, they turned to the Internet asking about the best hand-scooped ice cream. Chocolate Shoppe Ice Cream out of Madison, Wisconsin, was the answer, and from then on has been their exclusive supplier, making Lolli & Bobo's the only licensed distributor of the brand in and around the Knoxville area.

Their ice cream is considered "super-premium" based on a lot of science stuff that's best left to discuss over a cone with Bobo. Today, according to their website, they serve up favorites such as "Fat Elvis," "Just Got Serious" and "Yippee Skippee," along with their





signature, "The Tennessee Twist"
— and all the normal flavors for those just wanting a good dose of, say, vanilla.

Spiced Apple Cider Margarita

Ingredients

4 oz spiced apple cider, I used Trader Joes brand 3 oz mezcal or tequila, I used Madre Mezcal 1 oz Cointreau, optional Juice from 1 lime Ice

Rim:

- 2 tsp white sugar
- 1 tsp brown sugar
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp flakey salt

Garnish (optional):

Lime wedge Apple slices Cinnamon stick Star anise

Instructions

- 1. First, rim your glasses. On a small plate, mix together the sugars, cinnamon and salt. Using the flesh of a lime, coat the rim of your glass thoroughly then immediately coat in the cinnamon sugar mixture.
- 2. For the cocktail, add 1 cup of ice to a cocktail shaker. Pour in the apple cider, tequila, Cointreau, and lime juice. Shake until ice cold.
- 3. Add ice to the rimmed glasses and strain the cocktail over the ice. Garnish with an apple slice, star anise and cinnamon stick if desired.

Apple Cider Margarita

This easy apple cider margarita pairs fresh apple cider & apple butter with tequila for the ultimate Fall margarita recipe! Truly the perfect Thanksgiving margarita. Ingredients

Cinnamon Sugar Rim:

- 2 Tablespoons sugar
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 2 lime wedges

Margarita Ingredients:

34 cup apple cider 6 ounces

- 3 ounces tequila
- 2 Tablespoons apple butter
- 1 Tablespoon agave optional, add for a sweeter cocktail
- 1 ounce cointreau
- 1-2 cups ice for cocktail shaking and serving cocktails

Optional garnishes

2 cinnamon sticks apple slices

Instructions Cinnamon Sugar Rim

- 1. First, mix the cinnamon and sugar in a shallow bowl. Then, take the lime wedge and run it along the rim of each cocktail glass to moisten it. You can also use an orange wedge or lemon wedge.
- 2. Dunk the cocktail glass rim into the bowl of cinnamon sugar and swirl it around until coated. Set aside for at least 2 minutes so the rim has time to harden before pouring in the cocktail.

Make the margaritas

- 1. Add the apple cider, tequila, apple butter, agave, and Cointreau to a cocktail shaker. Then, fill the shaker to the top with ice.
- 2. Add the lid and vigorously shake until the glass is frosted. Then, strain the cocktail into the two cinnamon sugar rimmed glasses.
- 3. Serve with optional garnishes including cinnamon sticks and apple slices. Enjoy!

Hardin Valley resident gains by losing

L osing weight for some is about like foretelling the future. You have to keep trying to see how close you can get based on the effort you put into the prediction.

For Hardin Valley's Brenda Owensby, like for so many others, the journey to weight loss wasn't a straight line shown in a crystal ball. It was, and is, a zig-zagging path from the start, from yesteryear to yesterday, to today and to tomorrow.

An "Army brat" most of her youth, who'd been in 12 elementary schools by sixth grade and five high schools after a three-year stint in Italy, she focused more on her studies, always being the new kid wherever her father was stationed, while her parents began in turn to focus more on her weight.

"One of my first memories," Owensby recalled, "was being four and being on a diet." Her parents, she knows, were trying to do what was best for their daughter. "So, I don't have

bad memories of it," she added, "but I always struggled with weight."

In June 2021, after much prodding by her sister and niece, Owensby somewhat reluctantly joined the TOPS club—Take Off Pounds Sensibly, a non-commercial weight loss, education and support organization founded in 1948 with chapters across the United States and Canada—a formative summer for her in terms of acknowledgement and more.

Through COVID-19, Owensby worked as a psychologist at a long-term care facility. "I saw how difficult it was," she witnessed, "for the heavier patients in terms of not only taking care of themselves, but for the nurses taking care of them ... and I wanted to be more independent growing into my later years."

She set her sights again on losing weight and getting healthy once and for all, beginning at first with the goal of shedding pounds for a necessary knee surgery. About a year later, she had her other knee operated on, which made her journey literally that much easier to walk. Her third boost came, she said, after the news



her daughter was moving back to Tennessee from New York with her husband to start a family broke.

Last year, Owensby was crowned the 2023 TOPS Tennessee Queen, having lost more weight across the state than any other female member of the program, logging a 98.5-pound loss to earn the title.

"It's a very humbling experience," she said of her victory. "My chapter was so happy for me. They were excited. I was excited to represent them. But I honestly," she confessed, "felt like they should all be up there with me."

And to that end, at her next chapter meeting, which she continues to lead, she told them, "This is my crown," which at that moment was sitting on a table before her, "And it's on the table and not on my head because, to me, it belongs to all of us. Not just me, because, really, I cannot say enough about the importance of the support of the group."

Owensby advice to others? "Find a reason to lose weight," she said. "And health, to me, you can't buy health. Health is so very important. Think about your long-term future and how you want to spend your golden years—whether you want to be disabled and a burden or whether you want to be an ac-



In the PSCC courtyard was a Founder's Day Music Festival featuring performances from The Fine Colombians, The JaByrdz and Julius Blue.


