





Head Coach

Among head coaches who go on to enjoy huge success at their high school alma mater, many point to their second season as one of major improvement.

Seemingly well-balanced with returning starters on both sides of the ball — plus one of East Tennessee's top kickers

who also will punt again in 2025 — Geoff Courtney's second season as Admirals skipper with Farragut High School football features almost twice as many seniors as 2024 (26 versus 14).

"We're quite a bit older in the makeup of our team," Courtney said. "I'm just excited for this group.

"A lot of guys that got some valuable experience last year get their opportunity to go out and shine as the guys that start," he added.


Moreover, "I feel good about where we are developmentally," Courtney said.

"I told the guys this before we left for the dead period (late June to first of July): 'that I think, on average per man, we're like 40 pounds stronger in the squat (versus 2024).'

"On average, we're probably 30 or 40 pounds stronger in the bench press," the coach added versus 2024.

Players speak/offense

An unselfish attitude also will help.



really looking forward to seeing what I can do and what my teammates can do this season," he added. "I'll be a starting outside linebacker and then getting some running back reps."

With the change, "I definitely had to gain some more weight, so I gained about 15 to 20 pounds since the end of last season," Haag said. "But my speed and strength have definitely increased, though, for sure. And I think this year I'm definitely a lot better athletically."

Known especially for his running as the team's back-up quarterback in 2024, "I'll definitely be in there for wildcat packages (usually quarterback run plays) and other special packages, too," he added.

Leading Courtney's offense is returning starting quarterback Corbin Hobson, a junior.

"I just learned how to read a defense real-time and know what's happening around me and know my surroundings and know what I can do," Hobson said about his growth as a

sophomore, "And to just get the ball out or make a gain on a run."

Looking back, "I think whenever I got under pressure, I made bad decisions, so my decision-making needs to be a little bit better this season," Hobson said. "But I've been working on my speed and my strength, and I think those have been pretty good things in the offseason."

"Both of these guys are great leaders, that's why they're here," Courtney said of Haag and Hobson on Media Day at Three Ridges Golf Course in July. "They both lead by example, but they're both really good at challenging and encouraging their teammates. They're not afraid to speak up when they demand certain things from their teammates."

Following a "practice and scrimmage with Greeneville and Daniel Boone" at Greeneville Friday, Aug. 1, Courtney said about his offensive positives, "we took care of the ball, we protected the quarterback and we were able to throw it and catch it well.

"We've got some work to do in the run game — but we had some bright spots there, too," the Admirals skipper added. "Charlie (Noble) ran the ball well," referencing the senior running back who led the Ads in rushing in 2024. "Carter Collier (sophomore) had some good runs and Nathan Jacobs, as a freshman, had some good runs."

Returning offensive linemen Connor Frynkewicz and Luca

Hofer (seniors who started all 11 FHS last year) and part-time starter **Michael Ullian** (senior) should lead the way up front.

Seniors **Bryson Bassett** and **Ayden Perez** and junior **Cole Disse** were all part-time offensive line starters last season. "Those guys are going to help us as we move forward through the early part of the year," the coach said. "We feel like we've got six or seven pieces there on the offensive line."

Among his wide receivers is explosive junior **Ethan Farhat**, who also returned kicks in 2024 and should again this season.

Farhat is "one of our big playmakers coming back," the Admirals skipper said.

Look for **Johnny Jacobs** (junior) and **Max Garfield** (senior) to also be key targets at wideout, having gained experience in 2024, along with senior tight-ends **Aaron Heatherly**, another returnee, and **Moses Burnette**.

Defense

"There's a bunch of guys on defense that have a lot of experience," Courtney said. "They might be retooled or reshuffled and in a new position this year like Noah, but we feel comfortable about where those guys are and just getting a bunch of game experience and them now being able to be productive."

Junior Harrison Smith and senior Zain Kureshi-Smith return in the FHS secondary, while junior free safety Maysn Apalategui got some valuable experience last year.

At linebacker joining Haag, senior **Connor Paris** is back as a starter, while sophomore **Colt Brooker** saw some key play-

ing time as a freshman in 2024.

"Then we've got **Owen Petoskey**, who's going to lead us up front on the defensive line," Courtney said about his 6-foot, 240-pound senior standout defensive end.

"Owen is one of the toughest workers and probably one of the more vocal guys." the coach added. "He was very productive all of last year. And he was really, really productive — maybe even more so — in our spring session. And (senior) **Stephen Doubleday** is back (at the other defensive end)."

Juniors Izaac Koga, Johan Graves, Tate Byrge and James Brown and senior Jackson Plumlee look to be important defensive line cogs.

Kicker

About senior star kicker Ryan McCue, "In our long line of good kickers that we've had the last 20 to 25 years, Ryan's been the most accurate," Courtney said.

Concerns

About concerns, "It's just the challenge of the schedule," Courtney said, which features six road games. "Early on, we're going to open up with the 5A defending state champions (versus Sevier County at Carson-Newman University)." Also featured is Powell, a perennial Class 5A state power, along with Bradley Central and new Region 2-6A foe Oak Ridge plus road trips to perennial 6A powerhouse Maryville, along with Cleveland, rival Bearden and Class 4A power Upperman (Cookeville).

Bearden High School has a new head football coach in 2025.

But he's no stranger to the local football scene and he's

also a familiar face at BHS: an ex-Bulldog multi-position standout player in the early to mid-1990s (Class of 1994), then the head coach — starting a little more than 10 years later — who enjoyed lots of high moments in his first go-around.

Brad Taylor returns to his alma mater this season after two years away from the game. He most recently coached at Karns High School (nine seasons) before resigning after the 2022 campaign.

And he's glad to be back on the sideline wearing BHS maroon and gray.

"Bearden is a special place. This is home and it's a really good situation," said Taylor, who replaces Josh Jones after he and the school parted ways in February following three seasons. "I played here and I've coached here, and this was the only place where I would've come back to coach."

Taylor coached the Bulldogs from 2007 through 2013, leading Bearden to the Class 5A state semifinals during his first

season at the helm with the Bulldogs.

He inherits a team that went 8-4 in 2024 and returns some talented skill players from last season.

Strengths, weaknesses, region

"We have good skill players, receivers, running backs, defensive backs and linebackers," Taylor said. "But we're a little thin up front.

"We'll have to build depth up front on both the offensive and defensive lines," he added.

With a lack of depth up front, the Bulldogs definitely will face some monumental challenges as they navigate a Region 2-6A schedule, which includes the likes of Maryville, Farragut, Cleveland, Bradley Central, Hardin Valley Academy and league newcomer Oak Ridge.

Top players, newcomers

Top returners for the Bulldogs include: **Grant Cross** (senior, wide receiver/safety); Liam Powers (senior, linebacker); Will Taylor (the coach's son who will play tight end and H-Back, senior); **Seth Henry** (senior, long snapper); Paxton Parrott (junior, running back/linebacker); Tyler Tummins (junior, wide receiver/safety): Jasston Chandler (junior, linebacker) and rounding things off is Mason



Foster (senior, cornerback).

"Paxton is our basketball coach's son and he's a great athlete," Taylor said. "His older brother, Drew, was a great athlete and I would've liked to have a year with him. Paxton is a bigger kid."

"Coach Taylor is a great coach and I'm looking forward to the season," Powers said. "This will be fun and (Class) 6A football is the best football in Tennessee.

"We have a tough region with Farragut, Maryville and Hardin Valley," the senior added. "It just got tougher this year with Oak Ridge coming in. But this is going to be a fun year."

Key newcomers for Bearden, according to Taylor, are: TJ Edwards (sophomore, running back/linebacker/safety); Alonzo Sanchez (a senior kicker who transferred from Cookeville, who is the Cavaliers' all-time leading scorer); Logan Carpenter (a senior quarterback and linebacker who transferred from Cocke County) and Aiden Thacker (sophomore, quarterback).

"Alonzo's dad got a job here and they moved to West Knoxville and we're glad to have him," Taylor said. "He's Cookeville's all-time leading scorer and I'm sure that they're disappointed not to have him, but we're thankful to have him."

Carpenter and Thacker will compete for the starting quarterback position. "Logan is a good athlete and he'll play some

quarterback and linebacker for us and he'll give us some depth there," Taylor said. "Aidan is accurate and he has an extremely strong arm and he's done a good job picking up our offense."

'Best competition'

Bearden's non-conference slate features road games at Class 5A state power Knox West and new Class 4A member Alcoa (10-time defending Class 3A state champ) along with Tri-Cities foes Kingsport Dobyns Bennett and Johnson City Science Hill — both at BHS's Bill Young Field.

"As a coach, you want to play these teams; you want to play the best competition," Taylor said. "I'm excited."

Expectations may be modest at Bearden in 2025, but Taylor said he's enjoyed watching his new team during summer workouts.

"I really love the summer," he said. "I love the summer because that's where you concentrate on the process.

What a difference a year makes.


For the first time as Hardin Valley Academy Hawks, its 2025 football seniors have the same head coach for a second straight season.

got a good group of kids that are bought in, they're resilient, they're invested, they're selfless and they give great effort,' Wynn said. "I was trying to build it from the bottom up.

"We have a couple of guys we moved around and pieced in at different places," the coach added.

One of the Hawks' starting quarterbacks in 2024 "is going to play linebacker (and defensive end) for us this year," Wynn said about Umansky. "But he's a returning starter, right? He'll just be at a different spot. He's a bigger kid. He wasn't a traditional quarterback."

Offensive strengths

"Our traditional quarterback, Riley Matz, is going to be our starter barring something happening," the coach said about the junior. "He broke two fingers last year right before the season started, and we didn't get him back until week four, and then we slowly tried to plug him in there at times.

"But I feel like he's a lot more experienced now, and he's ready to go," Wynn added.

As for catching the ball, "We got some good skill guys at receiver that are returning," the coach said. "Nick Rivers, who was an All-Region kid last year (ex-defensive back), is coming back. He'll only be a junior, so I'm super excited about him.

"Cruise Furman is another one of those receivers that

started 10 games for us, and he's coming back," Wynn added about the junior. "Logan Holbrook (junior) is our tight end. He started 10 games for us and he's coming back. ... Then you've got guys like Brody Lamb (senior), who played secondary last year, who has stepped over and he's playing receiver for us.

"Really excited about that receiver core."

Defensive strengths

Then from a defensive standpoint, Mann "had 110, 115 tackles last year," Wynn said about the senior linebacker. "Was an All-Region guy.

"And then adding Umansky with him, I'm really excited about that linebacker corps," he added. "That's very big ... just the experience that they have of calling it, seeing it and getting guys lined up, getting them in the right place, setting things up to help us to be better."

Though listed as a linebacker, "As of right now, I'm playing and practicing more at the end, trying to help out there for depth reasons," Umansky said. "I think it's where I can help the team the most. ... But I'll be playing a little bit of both.

"Me and coach (John) Brewster, my defensive end coach, has really been working with me and helping me learn the position better," he added. "I think I've gotten a lot better in playing the defensive end position."

In the HVA secondary, "a lot of guys are returning,"





Wynn said. "Owen Vaughan (junior) played corner last year. He's coming back. Becks Allen started for us as a freshman last year at safety. He's coming back.

"We got two other guys that saw a good amount of time that are back in a rotation," the coach added, "including senior Gavin Ralston, who's come along. He's done everything we asked him to do since the time we got here. He's finally inched his way into that starting lineup. So we feel pretty decent about those guys" featured on defense.

"You've got guys like Nick Rivers, he also can play on defense if you need to go play some coverage (linebacker) or 'we need you at defensive end.""

"They got experience on both sides, so that's a good thing."

Up front, running backs

"I think up front, always, when you're playing in our region, that's one thing to look at," Wynn said about his offensive and defensive lines. "Everybody's got good lines on both sides, the offensive line and defensive line.

"We've got a few guys — I wouldn't say it's a weakness — but we're a little bit smaller up front than some of the people we're going to play," he added.

However, "We are super experienced on offensive line," Wynn said. "But we're still smaller than most of the people we're playing."

On the defensive line, 'We're replacing Michael Stewart, who played defensive end last year; First-team All-Region," the coach said. "You're replacing Nathan Holbrook, who kicked for

With the graduation of Kaden Cutcher, the team's rushing leader from 2024, "a few guys are going to fight for that position," the second-year coach said.

Special teams

To replace Holbrook as kicker and punter, the leader seems to be Logan Holbrook, Nathan's younger brother.

"He's a three-tool guy, and then he also plays tight-end," Wynn said. "And he's had a really good offseason, so we're excited to see him. Replacing Nathan is tough. If I got to replace him with anybody in the world, I wanted it to be his little brother."

However, "we've got about four guys that we feel all fit the mold," the coach said. "Some of them didn't even play last year. One of them, he never played football before and he was a soccer player, and so they won the state championship.

"He came out the day after the state championship (match)," Wynn added. "He was like, 'hey, coach, I want to play football."

How much better?

Overall, "We're going to be better, but that gap (in Region 2-6A) was big; is better enough? That's the question: how much better?" the coach said about improvement leading to victories.

"If you do anything for a year, you're going to be better at it the next year," Wynn added. "I feel like our guys have done the things we've asked them to do, and they've bought in.



picked up an offer from The Citadel a week or so ago. A really good player; I'm excited about him. He should have a huge year — I mean, he's a real problem for people.

When Steve Matthews undertook the task of rebooting the Concord Christian School high school football program, he knew it would be a challenge.

But it was a challenge he embraced.

During his first season with the Lions, the team went 8-2 while playing a split schedule: five junior varsity opponents and five varsity games during the school's first season since 2018.

The coach has had conversations with others who have started or restarted programs, and they've told him to expect some difficulty in 2025 — Concord's first in seven years as a full-fledged TSSAA playoff eligible program in Division II-A East Region.

But he's not listening to naysayers.

"I've talked to some coaches around the state, at both small and large schools, who have done startups, and they tell me that Year 2 might be a little tough," said Matthews, who was previously the head coach at Knoxville Catholic High School where he led the Irish to a pair of state championships. "But we're excited and I'm optimistic.

"We have about 40 guys on our roster, and that looks to be a good number for our league," he added. "I think we can win some ballgames."

The Lions were slated to play a 10-game varsity schedule this season. The schedule, however, has dropped to nine games as The King's Academy in Seymour and The Webb School in Bell Buckle recently announced they would not field teams in 2025, costing Concord a pair of region con-

The Lions have replaced their game against Bell Buckle, which was scheduled for Sept. 12, with a tilt against Christ School (North Carolina). The game against The King's Academy, slated for Sept. 26, had not been replaced at press

Concord, which was independent in 2024, will compete in the East Region of Division II-A, which now includes Middle Tennessee Christian, Providence Academy (Johnson City), Providence Christian School (Murfreesboro) and Grace Baptist (Chattanooga).





"Our biggest issue is youth," Matthews said. "It all depends on how quickly our young guys develop and mature.

"The other thing for us is to continue to build depth."

Final scheduling thoughts

Looking back to 2024, "I think we built this the right way," Matthews said. "We did this the right way by playing five varsity games and playing five JV games."

CCS also faces another unique challenge this season, as it will have only one true varsity home game. The Lions will host South Greene beginning at 2 p.m., Friday, Oct. 17. They'll play Providence Academy at Carson-Newman University in Jefferson City.

Concord will play its other home games at Blankenship Field in Oak Ridge.



While Knoxville Catholic has 19 starters returning according to head coach Phillip Shadowens, one stands out in a huge way.

Shadowens might be biased about the degree of Fighting Irish skill position talent, but he's been told something quite special "from the college coaches

around that I've called."

What? "Tyreek King is probably the best high school receiver in America," the third-year KCHS coach said about his senior superstar. "To be that, that means he runs really good routes, has got great hands — the whole package. ... And his ability to get off the ball; he's really impossible to press at the line of scrimmage.

"He's committed to Tennessee, but everybody that has seen him — including this summer in his camps (a 5-Star camp **Phillip Shadowens** Head Coach

among them) — the feedback I get from college coaches is that he was the best one there at every camp," Shadowens

"He's got something that you can't teach, and that's the ability to get in and out of a break and be explosive and at full speed in one step."

Though King is only 5-foot-11, 175 pounds, "There's probably nobody that has as much explosiveness and wiggle and shake and then straight-line speed as Tyreek has," the coach added. "He's a 4.4 (second runner in the 40-yard dash). ... That's running with a laser (measurement), which is very accurate. That was with sweat pants on when he did that.

"And he's worked hard in the weight room this summer as well, probably put on 5 pounds of muscle this summer. He'll have to get a little thicker at the next level."

Other offense

"Our on-the-field strength is our skill positions, especially at receiver," the coach added.

Even beyond King, "We're very talented ... with a bunch of other kids," Shadowens said about his other receivers. "(Senior) Casen Jenkins is special. A big group of young kids that can really play: Brooks Johnston, Brayden (Howard) and (Braylen) Gibbs, A'mare McKenzie all those kids are young." All are sophomore except Howard, a junior.

Jenkins said about his receiving goals this season, "a thousand yards and a hundred catches.

"Our whole offense is coming back, with (quarterback) Mack (Bartholomew) starting and all of our receivers and



running backs coming back," the senior added.

Running the football will be "our tailbacks: Matthew Rogers (sophomore) and other kids who are coming on, Kruise Buntyn (freshman) and Isaac Hooper (sophomore)," Shadowens said.

Bartholomew, a junior, started all 11 games in 2024, with three-year starting quarterback Jayden Neal missing his entire senior season due to injury.

"His offseason has been incredible," Shadowens said about Bartholomew. "We expect him to be a big-time player.

"You can't do anything to replace experience, you've just got to get it," the coach added. "... To be able to handle those situations and all the pressure that sometimes you feel from a Friday night and to be able to deal with that throughout the year, it's priceless."

"It's just really made me tough," the junior quarterback said about his 11 games last season. "It made me know what to expect this year in the season. Just to get that experience under my belt, learning what it takes, how much work you have to put in to really be suc-

cessful in our league. It's really just helped with all that."

While praising King in the passing game, "That opens up everything else on the backside with having Casen on the outside, getting open, just sitting in the windows, especially in zone," Bartholomew said. "He just really, really sits in the window when they're over there doubling Tyreek.'

Bartholomew "couldn't play his freshman year because he tore an ACL," Shadowens said.

Up front, "We're probably less experienced on the offensive front, but we've got kids that have come in and moved in that are big, strong, physical kids," the coach said without giving names.

Defense

"We have three kids over there that lead our defense," Shadowens said.

Senior safety/outside linebacker George Mancini "was out with an ACL (knee) injury last year. ... It really hurt us

A "young secondary features a bunch of those kids that started as freshmen who are going to be sophomores," the coach said without giving details. "They've been offered by numerous colleges around the country. They're very, very talented — but it's nice to have that senior leadership role that can keep it all together."

> Along the defensive line, "We feel like we've certainly made a lot of progress up front," Shadowens said. "Anton Hamilton (5-foot-9, 265, senior) is an unblockable big lineman that we have to go along with some other kids. But that is the name that I would mention right now."

Biggest strength

"The biggest team strength is, I think, our leadership," Shadowens said. "We've got a group of seniors that are true leaders in and out of the locker room. I think that's what you have to have in high school football. You have to have players that set the tone for you from a kid's perspective. I think that would be our biggest strength. "

Concerns

"Probably be in our league, you need as much depth as you can up front," Shadowens said. "Everybody two-platoons up front, but we're not quite to the point that we can completely two-platoon.

"We do have more linemen in our program that are going to be able to really function at a high level in our league, but we still won't be able to completely two platoon those guys,' he added. "... We still need to gain more depth. That's some-



Shavar Young (6-foot, 185), a Clemson commit, and Greg Tate III (5-foot-8, 160).

"Good balance," Mahoney said of his ball-catchers. "Good speed (Young and Gray); tight ends are good targets." Webb also is well-stocked with backup receivers.

Mahoney's offensive line has size, experience and depth. Senior Marvin Hicke (6-foot-4, 240) returns at left tackle. Freshman Gabriel Gonzalez (6-foot-2) will start at left guard.

Sophomore Connor Garmer (5-foot-7, 190) and freshman Brayden Gonzalez (6-foot-2, 285) will compete at center. Garmer started at the position last year.

Junior Will Overton (6-foot-2, 230) will start at right guard. Overton started two years ago but was hurt last year. Jake Rogers, a 6-foot-4, 300-pound sophomore, will take reps at right guard as well.

Senior Michael Pemberton (6-foot-3, 240) will man right tackle. Freshman Jamil Thompson (6-foot-5, 305) also get snaps. "We have size and competition (on the offensive line) we've never had here before," Mahoney said.

Hicke and sophomore Da'Ran Taylor (6-foot-1, 215) will be in the interior of the defensive line; both return as starters. Pemberton will return at one defensive end: the other will be a battle between Bowers, who returns to the position, and Walters. Backups will give the starters rest.

"Good depth," Mahoney said of his D-line. "I'm excited about them."

Mahoney's most work-in-progress unit will be the linebackers in his 4-3 scheme. Likely starters are junior Brayden Rivers (5-foot-11, 160) and sophomore Brody Kulisek (5-foot-11, 160) on the outside and Garmer in the middle.

"Running and striking ability," Mahoney said of Garmer.

Young and Tate — "they're the whole deal," Mahoney said — will return to the secondary as starting cornerbacks. Johnson returns to play safety ("outstanding player, total package"), along with sophomore Cullen Heck (6-foot-1, 160). Juniors Javon Dirl and Caleb Davis can help.

Porter will punt. Senior Clay Fultz returns as kicker. Young, Tate and Johnson will return kicks and punts.

"I'm trying to make it a player-led team," Mahoney said. I'm excited for this group; I like the direction it's heading."
